



Theme: God's holiness is not to be challenged—only received with humility.

1. Unchecked Pride: The Root of Rebellion (v. 1–11)

- How does pride disguise itself in spiritual or leadership settings today?
- What role does comparison or entitlement play in fueling pride in your heart?
- What would change if you began each day by identifying and confessing prideful attitudes?

2. God's Holiness: A Test of the Heart (v. 4–7)

- What does it mean to truly revere the holiness of God in your daily life?
- When has God used a moment of hardship to reveal something hidden in you?
- Where might God be calling you to deeper reverence or surrender?

3. Divine Justice: The Cost of Rebellion (v. 28–35)

- How does God's swift judgment in this passage shape your view of His justice?
- How do we wrestle with the tension between God's justice and His mercy?
- What lies do we often believe that minimize the seriousness of sin?

4. Abiding Prayer: To Stand in the Gap (v. 22, 44–48)

- What does it look like to "stand in the gap" for someone in your life right now?
- Why is prayer often our last resort instead of our first response in crisis?
- What keeps you from interceding for others with the urgency Moses and Aaron displayed?

5. Holy Atonement: To Stop Death (vv. 47–50)

- How does understanding Jesus as our ultimate atonement affect your view of sin and grace?
- In what ways are you tempted to add to or earn what Christ has already done for you?
- How can we help others embrace the sufficiency of Christ's atoning work in practical ways?
