



### 1. Devoted to the Way of Jesus (v. 42)

The early believers were not casual participants — they were devoted. Their lives centered on the way of Jesus: learning truth, living in fellowship, remembering Christ's sacrifice, and seeking God together.

#### Application Questions:

1. Why are the disciples focused on these elements (teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, prayers)?
2. Why is it important that they are included together in the life of the church?

### 2. Moved by the Wonders of God's Work (v. 43)

The early church lived in a state of holy awe: reverent wonder at the power and presence of God. Miracles pointed not to people, but to Jesus. That same Spirit still works today. Our call is to remain open, discerning, and full of gratitude for the ways God moves among us.

#### Application Questions:

1. What does this verse (v. 43) say about God, his character and purposes?
2. How can you cultivate greater awareness of God's presence and power in your daily life — even in ordinary moments?

### 3. United in Authentic Community (vv. 44–46)

The early Christian believers lived a deeply communal life that was supernaturally enabled by the power of the Holy Spirit.

#### Application Questions:

1. Why does the Spirit create a community, rather than just a group of individuals?
2. "All things in common" was descriptive, not prescriptive — but what would it look like for you to practice generosity that costs something?

### 4. Praising God for Favor and Fruit (v. 47)

The result of devotion, awe, and unity was joy, favor, and growth. The church's worship overflowed into witness. God Himself added to their number — this was not transfer growth but transformed lives.
