**Summary:**

**Icebreaker:**

When do you experience the greatest joy?

**1. Joy in the Revelation of Our King**

*Read Luke 2:10-11*

- Question 1: How has the "good news of great joy" personally impacted your life? Can you share a moment when God's presence brought you joy in the midst of fear or uncertainty?
- Question 2: The angels' message was for "all people." How can we reflect this inclusiveness during the Christmas season by sharing joy with those who might feel excluded or overlooked?

**2. Joy in the Reign of Our King**

*Read Isaiah 9:6-7*

- Question 1: What does it mean for Jesus to reign and rule in your life? Are there specific areas where you find it challenging to submit to His authority?
- Question 2: How can we practically live out the reality of Jesus as our King in our daily decisions and relationships, especially when circumstances are difficult?

**3. Joy in the Redemption of Our King**

*Read Romans 8:19-21*

- Question 1: Redemption means restoration and freedom from the curse of sin. How have you experienced God's redemptive work in your life? Are there areas where you are still seeking His restoration?
- Question 2: In what ways can we be agents of redemption in our community this Christmas, helping others experience the blessings of Christ's victory over sin and brokenness?
